Use junk modelling or collage to 'create' an animal of your choice.


Choose your favourite animal and make an animal mask.

Find out about animals that use camouflage. Why and how do they use it?




Can you write a list of animals that are herbivores, omnivores and carnivores? You could draw the animals too. Or you could put them into a Venn diagram

Collect recyclable materials and make an African animal.




Can you go on a minibeast hunt in our garden or if its safe, somewhere in your local area?

Can you gather and paint/ decorate pebbles to look like an animal or minibeast?




Look at animals that live in an African Savannah.
