



Leaf hedgehog




Materials and equipment:

A pair of scissors PVA glue


Autumn coloured paint or colouring pencils A selection of autumn leaves

Step 1




Go outside and collect some autumn leaves. The spikier the leaves the better, as hedgehogs are best known for their spikes.

Step 2



Carefully cut out the hedgehog template.

Step 3



Use the autumn coloured pencils or paints to colour in your hedgehog's body, face and nose.

Step 4



Finally, use your PVA glue to stick the autumn leaves you have collected onto your hedgehog.

Layer up to make even spikier.
